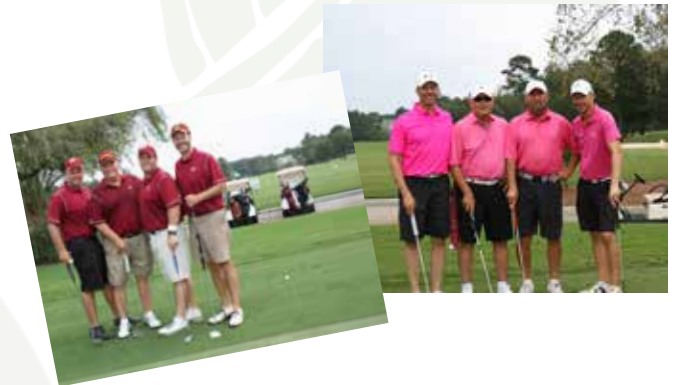
The winners of each flight then went head to head in a shootout where only one team would come out with the Member & 3 Guest Championship.

RIVER LANDING CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

Tropical Storm Hermaine tried to reschedule our Club Championship by dropping 9" of rain over 2 days and raising the river but we were able to crown two champions. The 36-hole gross competition was played on the Landing Course and considering the amount of rain was relatively dry and in perfect condition.

The Ladies' Club Championship had 7 of the top players in River Landing competing for their name on the trophy. Over the past 10 years, two names have repeated themselves atop the trophy and when the final round was complete, you can make it 11 years. 2015 Defending Champion Maureen McCarthy made a 15 foot par putt leaving her one shot shy of 2016 Champion Shelley Moorefield. Since Linda Guglielmi's victory in 2005, these two ladies, Shelley Moorefield (2006, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2016) and Maureen McCarthy (2008, 2012, 2014, 2015) have continued to put their names on the trophy.

COOKING WITH PETER

Greetings to all!

I can't believe how quickly the days of summer have peeled away, here we are in October and Autumn is starting to set in. We are so fortunate here in the southeast to enjoy fresh produce well in to October and sometimes November.

I have found great tomatoes as late as early November at Holden Family Farms in Shallotte, but recently I have found a surprising bounty of heirloom tomatoes at an auspicious venue (Eagle Island Seafood, ½ the price of this wonderful fruit at most other “markets”). I have always had a love for these beautiful and flavorful tomatoes.

I was very fortunate to grow up with local farms in Connecticut that would exclusively farm a wide variety of heirlooms, mostly in Glastonbury. You know it is all about the produce when you are instructed to pick your own bounty; weigh it and deposit the tariff in a wooden box! I was also fortunate to experience some of the best beefsteak tomatoes ever from Bartlett's Farm on Nantucket. Something about the salt in the air gave a different dynamic to everything grown from delicate lettuces, beautiful flowers, and signature tomatoes and corn that would rival any!

For this simple recipe the key ingredient is get the best and roundest tomatoes out there. Just get the best tomatoes from the farmer's market, or what is available. If it has a PLU # now is not the time for this recipe.

YOU WILL NEED:

- Beautiful tomatoes (preferably heirloom varieties)
- 2 Persian cucumbers, peeled and diced
- 2 shallots diced
- ½ green pepper ¼ “diced
- Kalamata olives (optional)
- 4oz of Parmigiano Reggiano

- 1/8 cup of basil chiffonade (basil leaves rolled like a cigar then thinly sliced across)
- Awesome extra virgin olive oil, don't skimp this is a very important ingredient
- Fresh cracked pepper
- Sea salt
- River Landing Boule or other crusty bread “day old” cut in to chunks

Is this starting to take shape? Yes you are about to make a panzanella salad!

Here is the key; dice the tomatoes thick and place them in the bowl that they will be served from. Salt them. Take the sea salt and be generous. The tomatoes will surrender their natural juices over time (10-12 minutes, 20 if you are patient!)

Add the diced cucumbers, green peppers, and red onions.

Drop the Kalamata olives and crusty bread chunks in to the salad

Sprinkle with basil and generous amounts of EVOO.

Don't forget a generous amount of fresh cracked pepper!

Let the finished product sit.

Just before serving scatter the Parmigiano Reggiano over the salad and toss gently

Wine Pairing

Tomatoes are one of the most difficult foods to pair wines with. Their acidity is a huge obstacle, and common practices with pairings are boring. My absolute favorite pairing would be a Spanish White Granacha blend called Cellar Piñol. I strongly recommend the Elicio rosé as well (stop by and ask for a taste). It has wonderful strawberry fruit with a slight herbaceous finish. It is an amazing Rose made from a blend of Grenache & Syrah. For something a little outside the box try a French Albariño from Laurent Miguel, slightly more body than a Spanish version.

I also love any Whites from the Rhone Valley; these are some of my favorite wines. Aromatic and approachable, they always have a balance between acidity, body, and nose. Try the Belleruche Cotes du Rhone Blanc, or if you are going to splurge and want something really special try the Domaine Galevan Chateneuf du Pape. A very rare wine but this particular vintage is drinking beautifully. This is my all time favorite white with honey & apricot on the nose. Full bodied yet a nice balance of acidity to provide a lively finish. If you want to play it safe go Pinot Grigio. Il Cantico is the Pinot Grigio you want from the club. This is a Pinot Grigio that is better than the San Margherita you might be familiar with.

O.K. You should, at this point, have poured a glass of wine for your self (I have, a couple of paragraphs ago). The magic has taken place, the salted tomatoes have started to weep their natural juices and combine with the EVOO, croutons, cracked pepper, and fresh basil. The best vinaigrette in the world is salted tomatoes mixed with EVOO. Grab your fork and dig in!
