SCHOLARSHIP HONORING TWO LONG-TIME RIVER LANDING RESIDENTS IS AWARDED

The Wallace-Rose Hill Friends of the Arts has awarded its inaugural scholarship in honor of two long-time River Landing residents. The Jack Zoesch/ Graham Phillips Scholarship is designed to help a Wallace-Rose Hill High School senior who plans to pursue a degree in the arts at an accredited college or university. The \$3,000 award is annual and non-renewable. The initial award was won by Mitchell J. Moore, who will pursue an education in music at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Mr. Moore has distinguished himself in his school's musical activities and his commitment to community service.

The scholarship is made possible by the generous support of River Landing residents, neighbors in the greater Wallace area, and the local business and corporate community. The Friends of the Arts awards the funds in memory of Jack Zoesch and Graham Phillips, two of the founding members of the Friends of the Arts, as well as respected leaders in the community and beloved neighbors in River Landing.

The Wallace - Rose Hill Friends of the Arts was created in 2004 to promote local cultural growth and awareness of the Arts. Its objective is to bring Fine Arts programs to the schools and the entire community, donating any surplus proceeds to the school system's Art and Music programs.

2017 RIVER LANDING LOCAL RULES

Below you will see the addition to the local rules which we adopted in March of this year. We've posted in both locker rooms and published in the April Newsletter, please make a note.

OUT OF BOUNDS

OB is defined by the inside point, at ground level, of solid white wooden stakes 2"x2". A ball that comes to rest on, or crosses a residential or paved road (even if it comes to rest on another part of the golf course) is deemed out of bounds.

WASTE AREAS

Waste areas located on the right side of Holes #10 and #14 of the Landing course are not hazards.

STONES IN BUNKERS

Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions (Rule 21-1 applies).

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTION CLOSE TO PUTTING GREEN

Any sprinkler head within two (2) club lengths of the putting surface and within two (2) club lengths of the ball (not in a hazard) is deemed to be an immovable obstruction and the player is entitled to relief as provided under Rule 24-2. In addition, if the sprinkler head intervenes on the line of play, the player may also take relief. If the ball lies through the green, the player must lift the ball and drop it, without penalty, within one club-length of and not nearer the hole than the nearest point of relief. The nearest point of relief must not be in a hazard or on a putting green. When the ball is dropped within one club-length of the nearest point of relief, the ball must first strike a part of the course at a spot that avoids interference by the immovable obstruction and is not in a hazard and not on a putting green.

SEAMS OF CUT TURF

Through the green, seams of cut turf (not the turf itself) are deemed to be ground under repair. However, interference by a seam with a player's stance is deemed not to be, of itself, interference under Rule 25-1. If the ball lies in or touches the seam or the seam interferes with the area of the intended swing, relief is available under Rule 25-1. All seams within the cut turf area are considered the same seam.

EMBEDDED BALL

Through the green, a ball embedded in its own pitch-mark may be lifted, cleaned, and dropped as near as possible to the spot where it lay, but not nearer the hole. The ball, when dropped, must first strike a part of the course through the green.

Exceptions:

- A player may not take relief under this Local Rule if the ball is embedded in sand in an area that is not closely mown.
- A player may not take relief under this Local rule if it is clearly unreasonable for him to make a stroke because of interference by anything other than the condition covered by this Local Rule.

DOUBT AS TO PROCEDURE

In stroke play, if a competitor is doubtful of his rights or the correct procedure during the play of a hole, he may, without penalty, complete the hole with two balls. After the doubtful situation has arisen and before taking further action, the competitor must announce to his marker or fellow-competitor that he intends to play two balls and which ball he wishes to count if the Rules permit. The competitor must report the facts of the situation to the committee before returning his score card. If he fails to do so, he is disqualified.

DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES

A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g., gradient, wind speed, temperature, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually used.

+ BALL AT REST MOVED (ON PUTTING GREEN)

Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1 are modified as follows:

When a player's ball lies on the putting green, there is no penalty if the ball or ball-marker is accidentally moved by the player, his partner, his opponent, or any of their caddies or equipment.

The moved ball or ball-marker must be replaced as provided in Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1.

This Local Rule applies only when the player's ball or ball-marker lies on the putting green and any movement is accidental.

Note: If it is determined that a player's ball on the putting green was moved as a result of wind, water or some other natural cause such as the effects of gravity, the ball must be played as it lies from its new location. A ball-marker moved in such circumstances is replaced.

HOLES-N-ONE

It's always a beautiful day here at River Landing and congratulations goes to Jim Sickels who made his first "1" on April 21st. He aced the 168 yard 16th hole on the Landing Course using his 4-hybrid. Not to be outdone, one day later, Bob Roman made his "1". He used his 7-iron from 138 yards to ace the 3rd hole of the River Course. On June 10th, Mike VanDiver made his 4th Career Hole-n-One (all here at River Landing) on Hole #8 of the Landing Course playing 156 yards. He used a demo 5-hybrid from the golf shop and following his round decided to purchase it. We can't guarantee a Hole-n-One with every demo club but it's worth a try!

REMINDERS

Golf Cart Pairing Up – Are you one of the many groups who need 3 carts for 3 or 4 players? Please pair up when leaving the 1st Tee and make sure there are 2 riders in each cart. It is careless and adds age to our cart fleet if you don't!

Golf Shop Vendors – Please know that just because you don't see it in the golf shop doesn't mean we can't order it! We can compete and usually offer a better price on new products than most golf stores. Please ask a member of the golf staff for a price if you don't see it in the golf shop.

Golf Course Cart Towels – Please, Please, Please return any cart towels you may have accidentally taken home or left in your vehicle.

Safety First – Please wait for the golfers ahead of you to clear the landing area before you hit your next shot. It only takes one errant shot to change our community. Are you really impatient enough to jeopardize someone's life? If you are, think about someone doing the same thing to your spouse, child or best friend. It's just a game!

Practice Range Mats – When the balls are set to hit on the range mats, please only hit on the mats. They are intended to protect and prolong the natural grass tee for all golfers.

Cigarette Butts & Trash – Please keep River Landing Green & Clean “No butts about it!” We would like to inform all smokers that we do have ashtrays for golf carts so please ask the staff for one and help us keep our golf courses free of butts!!!

Decorative Grasses – Please do not drive golf carts or push carts through the decorative grasses. There should never be any vehicles in the grass. This will not be tolerated.

Back Driving Range - Please keep golf cart traffic limited to the cart path or beside the south practice tee. Our maintenance staff is trying to improve and beautify our practice area and the traffic elimination will help substantially.

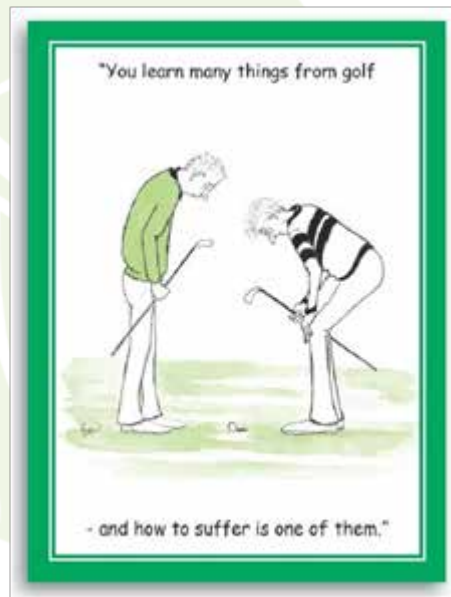
