In an effort to do so we are introducing a fantastic program out of the PGA of America called Operation 36.

Operation 36 is a phenomenal way to learn, grow, and sustain this great game that we all love. It doesn't matter if you are new to golf or have been playing for some time and simply want to improve different aspects of your game. Operation 36 could be the answer to keeping practice fun, easy, at your own pace, and participation in this program will likely lead to better scores!

So how does it work? The golf staff will be offering sessions throughout the year that anyone can sign up for. The program is 8 weeks in length and provides clinics on areas of the game, weekly playing opportunities, and access to

the Operation 36 app which allows players to track their progress.

Operation 36 has the same goal whether you are a junior golfer or an adult golfer, and it is pretty simple. We want you to improve your game and have more confidence while out on the course. For the junior golfer it provides a way to track development, helps parents give motivation of continuing progress, and allows the coaches to see progression and lay the plan needed to lower handicaps. For adults it introduces a clear path to better your game, hone your skills, and become more confident. The program lays out avenues for both beginning golfers and those who have been playing for some time. Adults are supplied with a game plan that mirrors that of the juniors with the ultimate goal being to shoot a score of 36 on 9 holes!

Many people make the mistake of pruning Crape Myrtles too severely. So what to do if you have them and don't like them in the shape they are in? Let me see if I may help some of you make better decisions regarding pruning your Crape Myrtles properly or making other decisions for the plants.

When pruning Crape Myrtles think about the end product and what you want them to look like before cutting anything. Then follow these best practices:

- 1. Remove all dead, diseased, or damaged wood.
- **2.** Remove crossing and/or rubbing branches.
- **3.** Prune extreme out of bounds (extra-long branches) to a node.
- 4. Reduce size only if you have to. Major pruning of Crapes removes the natural look of the plant and reduces overall vigor, natural defense from pests, and air movement through the plant. It has been scientifically proven that severe pruning does not improve blooming of Crape Myrtles. However, it does make your crapes

look like mushrooms or snowcones if you like that look.

- 5. Remove seed heads if they are an eyesore to you but remember, birds really like those when there is nothing else around to eat during the winter months.
- branches down to a pencil width or about the size of your little finger has been done from an aesthetics standpoint for the winter. I don't recommend this anymore but have seen this done in good taste and it does make the plant look better at a front door.
- 7. Clean up debris from under the plant in landscaped beds or tree rings and dispose of any material away from plant beds.

If this pruning doesn't get you what you want, then consider the following options:

• Cut back hard with the understanding that a Crape Myrtle

will typically grow back. That means a plant will most likely continue to grow into or onto a house if it is planted too close, despite hard pruning. Try moving it farther away from the structure or choose a different plant.

- Once Crape Myrtles have been severely pruned it may take up to 4-5 years for correction. Knuckles seem to form if they are overpruned each year.
- Plant the correct Crape Myrtles in the correct place. There are multiple varieties with different sizes and shapes. Make sure you are choosing the one that works best for your home and landscape.


Holiday Oheer






DUPLIN CHRISTIAN OUTREACH MINISTRIES
