



summer!







ON THE GREEN

I'm often told by our members that they just can't hit the soft short shot onto the green when the flag is close to the edge. I'm not talking about a shot from 50yds, but a shot that is just a few yards or a few feet off the putting surface. Our approaches and areas around the greens are cut very close and this makes it very difficult if you do not have confidence in your ability to hit the shot. So why not putt it? Putting from off the green is a great way to avoid the bad shot and get the ball close to the hole. Here is how you do it.


Take your regular grip like you are taking a full swing. This will provide you some more power and you want some wrist action while hitting the putt.

Stand tall over the ball. Standing tall allows the hands room to move and the ability to make a bigger stroke.

Don't try to hit a slap shot. Swing the putter back longer and have a fluid motion through the ball which keeps the ball lower and allows you to control the distance better. Never try and force the shot.

Finally, use your lower body. Let your hip and legs move towards the target. This provides more energy and prevents you from trying to overpower the shot.

These four simple suggestions can go a long way in helping you get more confident around the greens!



November is the driest month of the year so it is recommended that you wait until late November or early December to shut down and drain irrigation if weather permits. To keep a strong root system and provide a good jump start in the spring, add

a little water to your lawn if needed. It will help the roots get through the winter.

Any new plantings done in the fall may also need supplemental watering during the late fall to early winter. Warm soil temperatures can allow trees and shrubs to continue providing root growth through the later part of the Even year. So if dry conditions persist, some irrigation during late fall can be good for your plants.

Mother Nature can change rapidly so be sure to turn irrigation off before cold weather sets in Wellheads be covered as well, and landscape.

don't forget to disconnect your water hoses from the faucets, or as we say in the south - "spigots". Water in a hose can freeze and breakage is possible, but most winters here are not cold enough to freeze pipes so blowing out the system is not typically necessary.

in cold weather, your landscape needs TLC. By following these recommendations, it should be ready to shine next spring!
