

Reflecting on the Past 20 Years

mind Today my wandering and it was all prompted by visiting а fairly new community in Wilmington to pick up shuffleboard donated а from one of our new River Landing residents. As I returned, I drove through felt the timing wasn't right our front gate and thought, hmmm, you only get one

went first-time drive into any community. Most members probably don't know that I actually drove through our gates 22 years ago, the first time I interviewed at River Landing for the Head Golf Professional position. I and didn't accept the offer. Two short years later the



position became available, I applied again, was offered the position, and I accepted. In the fall of 2003 I started and this is when the front gate became "our front gate" and River Landing became home.

When I take the time to look back at the past 20 years, I am amazed at how much has transpired in this community. Although I wasn't here in 1996 when River Landing started, there were so many stories handed down by members and staff that I already felt like part of the longtime family. When I started in 2003, there were 27 golf course holes, the River Lodge, and two small trailers; one for the Golf Shop and one for the snack bar (and yes, Connie and Pam were already here). We then built the Fitness

Center, moved the trailers, added some size and a deck to make room for our new Clubhouse to be built, and added nine more holes. Boy we've been having fun for the past 20 years! There are so many members, guests, and staff to thank for all of River Landing's success - too many to mention here. The past 20 years of my career are full of great memories and outstanding stories, which is part of growing up in an awesome community like ours.

I started at River Landing when I was 40 years old, (yes, I turned 60 recently) and with the exception of hitting it 20 yards shorter off the tee, I don't feel much different. I can honestly say I didn't think much about the future when I started, but I can say without a doubt, I

have enjoyed every moment of my last 20 years in River Landing. As I entered the gate today and drove down Paddlewheel, I realized it is very different than 20 years ago, although many things remain the same. It is still so wonderful, peaceful, relaxing, exciting, and most beautiful. certainly The first drive I experienced in the newer community in Wilmington didn't compare to River Landing 20 years ago or now, not even close. I truly look forward to the next 20 years here at River Landing creating more memories, stories, and meeting new members. I hope they are just as good as the past 20 years and I truly expect they will be.

FIND A BALANCE

It's truly amazing how hot it has been this summer but everyone keeps playing golf and enjoying our beautiful golf courses. We are very lucky to have two great courses to play each day, along with having so many fantastic members!

The courses have definitely gotten busier over the past few years which is never a bad thing. With the added play sometimes we find ourselves either pushing groups or being pushed by other groups while playing. This is the norm on the golf course but how we handle these situations can affect how someone's round will be for the day. I'm going to give suggestions that you some might help and make sure you enjoy every round of golf you play.

Always make sure you arrive for your tee time early. Showing up for your tee time last minute can cause issues not only for you but the groups that are behind you. It basically puts you on the clock for running behind the desired time to play.

Be aware of the pace of play and where you are to the group in front of you. If you are keeping up with the group in front of you then you are on pace.

Always play ready golf. This means being prepared when it comes time for you to hit your shot. Have your yardage, help others in your group with their yardage, have a club selected, and avoid sitting in the fairway or tee box carrying on conversations and losing track of the time.

If you are behind a group that is playing slowly please do not try and push them! Be patient and contact a member of the golf staff. We will head out and talk to the group for you. Being patient can go a long way to everyone enjoying their round.

When playing behind a group that is slow, we ask that you do not hit into the green until the group has cleared the green and moved away in their carts. You never know where the ball may go and someone could get hurt if they are close to the green.

If you feel like you are holding up a group and you wish to let them go through please signal them to do so. After they hit a shot you may still be able to putt or play a shot while they are making their way to the green or fairway. This will also help with the pace of play.

Another option is to simply pick up 2 to 3 minutes per hole. This goes a long way and will get you back on time within just a few holes. You'll also make the groups behind you very happy! Remember that playing slowly can be upsetting to golfers but playing too fast can be just as aggravating. Keep in mind to find a balance!

Following these simple rules can help everyone while playing the courses. With the temperatures being high by mid-morning, playing at a good pace is very important. The golf staff always want you to have a great time while on the course and it starts with playing at a nice pace.



RIVER LANDING MENS GOLF ASSOCIATION quarterly update

"Where River Landing men meet to share a laugh, a beer, and some golf"

The 2023 RLMGA golf season has continued through the 2nd quarter (June - August) with a mixture of some rain and very hot weather. Since the last update, we have held two more tournaments, the Murphy Cup, and the Summer Classic. These were both a success with 64 and 75 players respectively, for an average of 69 players. The winnings purse for each tournament was \$500, as budgeted. Meals were provided at the Clubhouse to all participants once they completed their round.

Regarding Play Days during this quarter, there were 31 dates scheduled, with one cut short due to rain. For the 310 dates played, we averaged 39 players. Attendance this year favored Tuesdays once again with an average of 49 players, while Thursdays only averaged 28 players.

During this quarter we also held the always popular Potof-Gold Day on July 25th. This tournament occurs twice each year, once in the middle and once at the very end of the season. On this Play Day, extra money that has been set aside from each Play Day is paid out as extra winnings. Every participant is guaranteed to win something. This tournament requires a minimum of 8 days to be played prior to the event to qualify for participation. This year we had 54 players participating and paid out a total of \$939 to the field. Winnings ranged from \$12 to \$22 for the big winners.

Our popular Hot Dog Day was held on July 25th. Thanks to Paul Izzo and his crew of volunteers for supporting this effort. They cooked the dogs and made sure everyone had their meal available as they came off the course. Great job as usual!

We have had some great play by our members again this quarter. Since the last update, we have had a slew of holesin-one and eagles. Barry Roth, Denny Zalar, Wayne Weller, Dick White, Barry Kane, Frank Wood, and Jeff Mandusky all had holes-in-one. The sun has begun to set a little earlier each day, so you know what that means - fall is creeping in here in Eastern North Carolina. Here are a few things to consider for your fall gardens.

1. If you plant a fall veggie crop, now is the time. This can be done in pots or small beds in the garden. Cabbage, kale, collards, onions, even tomatoes, and a few other veggies can thrive as the temperatures slowly come down.

2. Don't forget to water during the fall as needed. August has been very dry, and September and October have also been known to present dry in some years past. Therefore, it is important to make sure trees, shrubs, and even turf areas are getting adequate water until dormancy sets in.

3. Pruning this time of the year should be limited as we go into late September and October. Most plants are dropping leaves and setting buds for next year so pruning some plants can eliminate flowers for next year.

4. Make sure leaf debris from the fall are cleaned at season end to minimize the chance of developing diseases over the winter. January is a good time for cleaning beds to ensure plant and garden health.
