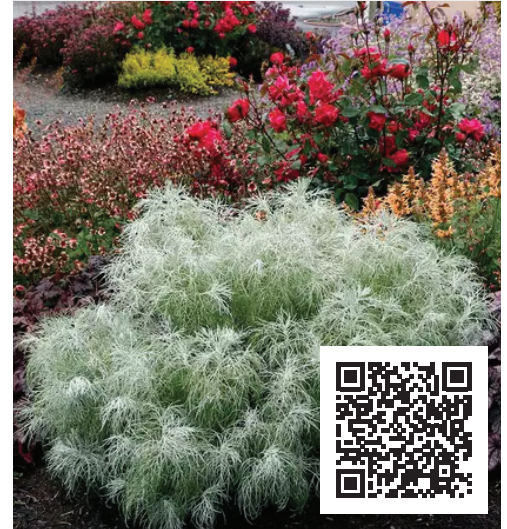

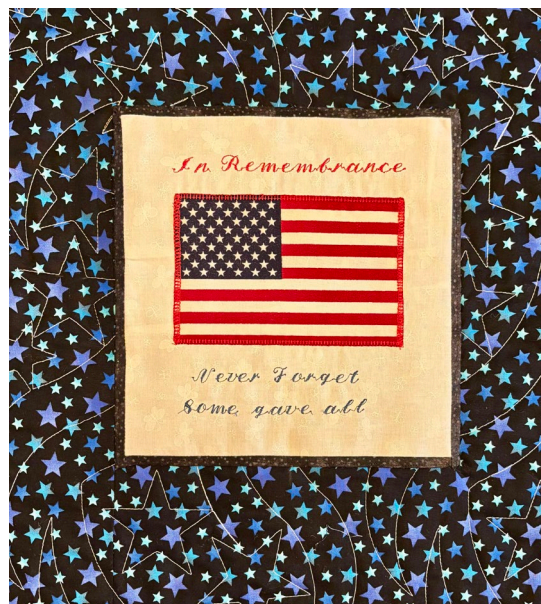
Meet the Staff!

Winter Landscaping

DURING THE COLD MONTHS OF WINTER, IT CAN BE EASY TO FORGET ABOUT YOUR LANDSCAPE.

Many of us plant in the fall, but come winter, the holidays, vacations, and other obligations take over. People stay inside more, and it can be challenging to stay on top of your landscape or garden and how it responds to the winter weather. Here are a few tips to keep in mind so your landscape will thrive again in the months ahead.

Removal of debris from beds and gardens can reduce disease in the upcoming spring. Old, dead wood tends to harbor disease. By removing unwanted sticks and leaves during the winter, you can reduce the risk of a disease prone bed or garden.

Watering is especially important during the winter months for all new plant material that is less than a couple of years old. Properly watering, especially when drought is present, is important to make sure plants are ready for growth in the spring. Too much or too little water can both be an issue, so check the soil before you water.

Pruning during the winter is a good way to reduce the size of plants, remove deadwood, and help control the spread of disease in the landscape. Proper pruning of shrubs, especially cutbacks, is important this time of the year. Tree pruning during the winter is also recommended.

Other items to consider:

The dead of winter is the perfect time to have your mower serviced and the blades sharpened. Also, don't forget to sharpen your pruners, shovels, garden hoe, and other yard tools. This is sure to save time when warm weather reappears!

Design changes, planning new beds, and adding new planting areas can also be done during the winter season. Having a written game plan for new items to check off in the garden is most helpful as you plan for springtime.

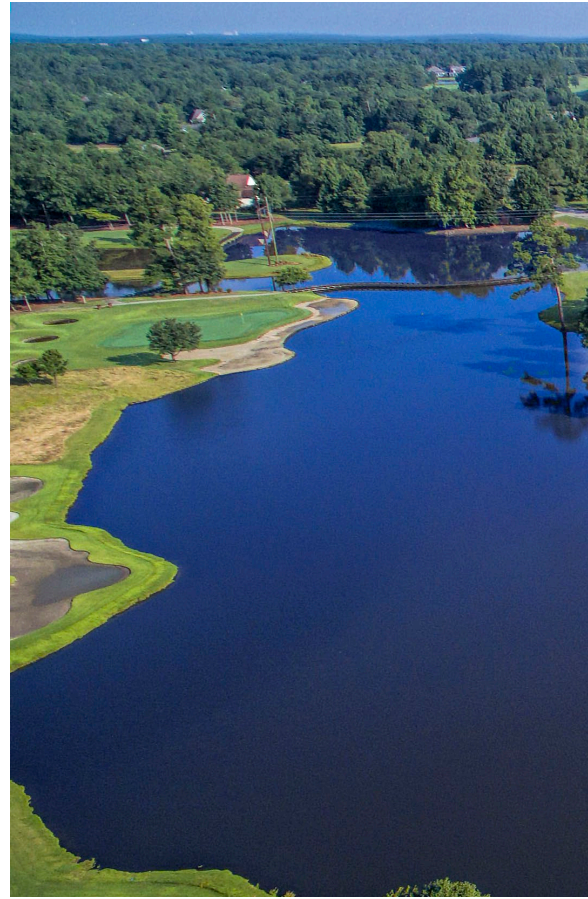

There almost always were six other golfers in his group, and many are still friends who I talk to often. My wife Patty went this past August and she could finally

understand why it is such a special place and Bob is a special friend. Again, at 92 he has a different perspective which I will always appreciate, and I look forward to our next round together.

Finally, golf allowed me to cross paths with Bob Miller, 94 years old and obviously not the "young" Bob Miller some of you may know. Bob was one of the first members I met when I came to River Landing 21 years ago. He was president of the Senior RLMGA at the time and, although he hasn't played lately, I believe he still has more rounds to play. You may see him starting the RLMGA on a Tuesday or a

Thursday but, rest assured, at 94 he is willing to share his different perspective.

Looking back, as a 13-year-old swiping my grandfather's golf balls in his back yard - which wasn't more than 50 yards long - I'm really surprised I didn't break more than just a few windows. But I'm certainly more surprised at what the game of golf has brought to my life. A career, family, friends, so many great places and unbelievable memories. All I can say after thinking of all these blessings is one thing, Thank You, Jesus!



River Landing Club Decorum

Every Club Member should have received a Membership Plan including the Rules & Regulations. I am going to touch on some of the things I've discussed with various members who were unaware of these rules, as well as certain issues brought to the attention of the Advisory Board of Governors for River Landing. My goal is to educate and to help prevent issues from arising. This also helps the appropriate staff and management deal with these matters.

- Hopefully, the Golf Cart GPS system is fine-tuned to enhance your golf experience as intended, while also controlling golf cart traffic and wear patterns. If you have any problems, please note the golf cart number and communicate to the golf professional staff.
- In the best interest of the entire membership, we ask all Members to cancel their tee times 72 hours in advance. This provides more tee time options for our Members who choose to book closer to their desired date. If you have trouble, please contact the Golf Shop to adjust.
- River Landing Sports Club is different than the River Landing Community. The Sports Club includes the (2) 18-hole golf courses, practice range and supporting facilities, Clubhouse, Fitness Center - which includes a heated outdoor pool, health and exercise equipment, pickle-ball and tennis courts, and other recreational facilities. You must be a paying Member of the Sports Club to use its amenities and your Membership Class will define which facilities you can use and how often.
- Headphones or ear buds are encouraged at the pool. When headphones or ear buds are not in use, volume must be maintained at levels so as not to disturb others. That means, the volume is for you to hear and not others.
- No glass containers at the pool, it's NC state law.
- All guests at the pool, tennis courts, and pickleball courts must be accompanied by a Club Member or designated user.
- Abuse, verbally or otherwise, reprimand or discipline of Club personnel by Members will not be tolerated. If a Member has a concern, it should be brought to the attention of the manager of the employee.
- While using Club facilities, each Member shall possess their membership card. This will help you gain access to certain Club facilities and will help make sure your Member charges are correct.
- A Member may have no more than four guests use the Club's facilities at any one time without the approval of Club Management.
- Adult supervision for children under the age of 16 is required at the Clubhouse, Tennis Courts, Golf Courses (unless approved by the golf professional staff), Fitness Center, and Outdoor Pool.
- I am sure there will be more issues I will touch on in the next newsletter. Please understand, the Membership Plan and Rules & Regulations are not intended to restrict, but to guide the membership and staff of River Landing Sports Club to maintain a safe and enjoyable club.

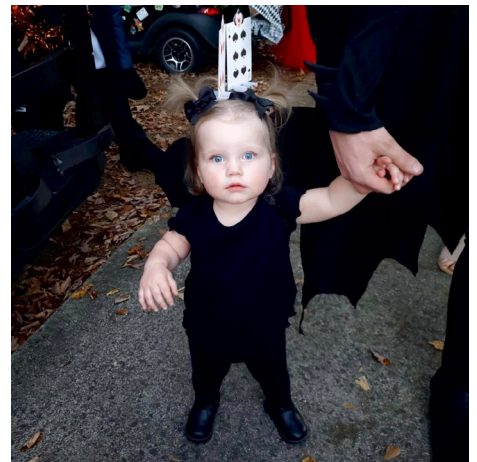
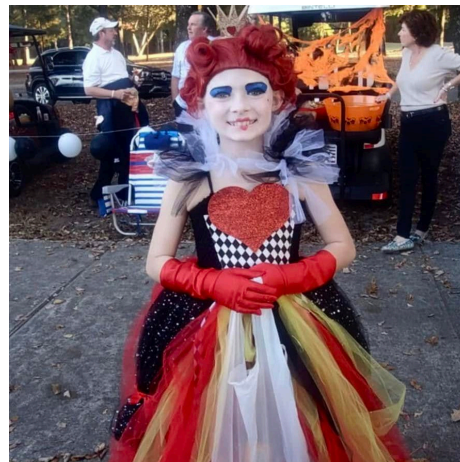
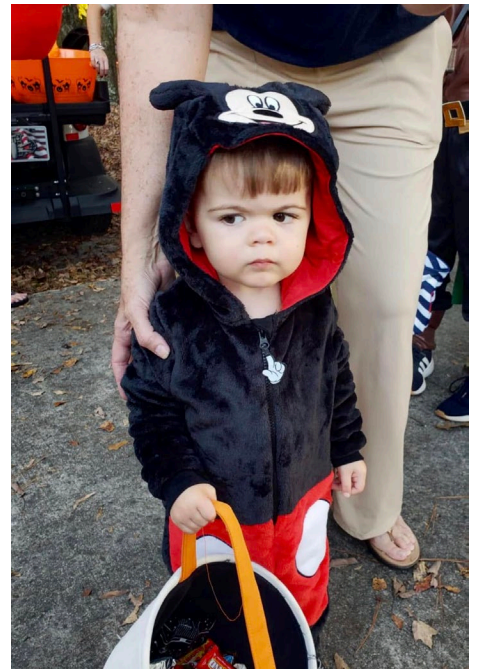
